Subject: Summary of 2025 ACC-OC Sacramento Advocacy Trip

Introduction

A delegation of 40 members from across the Orange County region, including elected officials and regional agency leaders, participated in a series of meetings in Sacramento. These meetings provided an opportunity to discuss key policy priorities, legislative initiatives, and funding opportunities with state agencies, legislators, and policy experts. The delegation engaged in productive discussions on such as housing, transportation, environmental sustainability, and economic development.

MEETINGS SUMMARY

State Agencies and Boards

- California State Water Resources Control Board (Joaquin Esquivel, Chair)
 - Discussed strategies for expanding water storage and supply reliability.
 - Addressed funding opportunities for stormwater capture, groundwater replenishment, and recycled water projects and PFAS.
- California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) (Donna Berry, Deputy Director)
 - Outlined funding mechanisms for local transportation improvements.
 - Reviewed efforts to streamline project delivery and regulatory processes.

CalTrans Progressive Design Build

<u>The Progressive Design-Build (PD-B) Program</u> is an innovative delivery method that is a 2-phase variation of Design-Build. PD-B involves the design-build team during the earliest stages of project development to provide a design up to 100% design then agree to a price for final design and construction.

<u>California's Sustainable Insurance Strategy</u> represents a proactive and comprehensive approach to safeguarding the interests of Californians in the face of climate change challenges. California Climate Investments

The <u>No Wrong Door System</u> ensures that older adults, people with disabilities, and caregivers can access services and support regardless of where they seek help. Key aspects include:

- No Wrong Door Access: Individuals can receive assistance from any entry point—whether through healthcare, social services, or community organizations.
- Aging and Disability Resource Connection (ADRC): A statewide network providing personcentered counseling, information, and referrals.
- Streamlined Navigation: Reduces bureaucratic barriers, allowing individuals to find the right services without being turned away or redirected multiple times.
- Cross-Sector Collaboration: Integrates services from healthcare, housing, transportation, and social support systems to ensure holistic care.
- Equity & Inclusion: Ensures that underserved populations have access to culturally competent and linguistically appropriate resources.
- Technology Integration: Uses data-sharing and digital tools to enhance coordination between service providers.

CalHFA Resources

- CalHFA FHA Program
 - Offers 30-year fixed-rate FHA loans for first-time homebuyers
 - Can be combined with down payment assistance programs
- Multifamily Programs
 - o Provides low-interest financing for affordable rental housing development
 - o Included programs for new construction, rehabilitation, and preservation
- California Dream For All Shared Appreciation Loan
 - Helps first-time homebuyers with down payment assistance
 - o Borrowers share a portion of home appreciation with the state upon resale
 - Interest rates and repayment terms depend on appreciation
- California Mortgage Relief Program
 - Provides grants (not loans) to homeowners behind on mortgage payments due to financial hardship
 - Covers delinquent mortgage, property taxes, and insurance
