






# Population Growth, 2010-2020

#### Most OC areas did not lose or gain

• 80% of tracts within 5% of 2010 population

#### Areas of population gain:

- New development areas
- Infill/redevelopment

#### Areas of population loss:

- Southern Santa Ana
- Areas built out in the 1980s and 90s
- Resort/vacation rentals



# Housing Growth, 2010-2020

#### Most OC areas did not lose or gain

• 85% of tracts within 5% of 2010 housing


Housing growth correlates with population change, but not perfectly!


- South Santa Ana and east Rancho Santa Margarita both added units, but lost residents'
- Old Towne Orange had flat housing growth but population growth.

Two tracts lost over 10% of housing – one in La Habra (possibly a statistical error) and one in the burn areas (Trabuco Canyon/Silverado)









## Orange County – Change in Race/Ethnicity





### Enrollment in K-12 Public Schools


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
